Volunteer hours-

There have been a lot of questions about volunteer hours. So, let's try and clear those up. The hours you spent on your capstone project are not counted as volunteer hours. We do want to know how many hours you spent on the projects you did-both the installation and the education and outreach projects. Knowing how much time these capstone projects took will help us refine and describe the program in coming years.

Any time you spent on anything else related to managing stormwater counts as volunteer hours. That means:

- Talking to neighbors about your project or the Stewards program
- Talking to your neighborhood or community group about stormwater
- Assisting other Stewards on their capstone projects
- Volunteering with MCWD on cleanup or community education programs
- Working with your community organizations on stormwater- churches, schools, garden clubs, or any other community group
- Presentations on stormwater at meetings, conferences, or other aatherinas
- Volunteering with Metro Blooms or other any water-related outreach to groups on stormwater projects- Minnehaha Creek Watershed District, Wild Ones, Audubon, İzaak Walton, Dept. of Natural Resources, Great River Greening, The Well, Women's Environmental Institute, Friends of the Mississippi River, etc.

If you are working on projects, educating about stormwater, it counts as volunteer hours.
